CUP AND ROAST

Nyeri Hill Farm coffee can be qualified as FAQ+ and is known for its distinct Nyeri main crop “Kenya Flavour” alongside fine acidity and solid body.

ECONOMIC BENEFITS

The coffee produced earns foreign exchange for the country. The farm also serves over 300 people directly who earn a living from it and over 16,000 people indirectly. Income from the proceeds has also aided to develop other dioceses’ that have been born from the Nyeri diocese e.g. Meru, Embu, Marsabit among others. The populace in the neighbourhood enjoy spiritual nourishment, social amenities and financial gain.
